

Underling Principles

- Accessibility,
- Caring for creation #1 priority: reduce/eliminate emissions

We know how:

- 1. Conserve energy
- 2. Electrify almost everything, and
- 3. Generate the electricity from zero emission sources of energy

Scope of work

- Accessibility Lift Elevator
- Insulate and Air Seal the Rectory and the Church
- Upgrade electrical distribution
 - Resiliency from flooding
 - Capacity for electric HVAC and ADA
 - Lines for induction clothes drier, stoves, heat pump drier, EV charging
- All electric HVAC and Hot Water
- Replace gas appliances
- Rooftop solar w/batteries

How to Pay for It

- Knowns
 - Parish building fund
 - Rebates, Tax credit direct payments utility programs, other benefits Inflation Reduction Act of 2022
- Possibilities
 - Metro IAF
 - Utility program National Grid HEAT
- Uncertainties
 - Grants
 - EMLI
 - Episcopal Church
 - Fundraising, capital programs

Resources for Non-Profits

- LIPA/PSEG (Con Ed?)
 - **POS Rebates** heat pump water heaters (\$1,000 or more)
 - Installer rebates- \$1,000-\$2,000/ton on air source and ground source (geothermal) heat pumps
- Metro IAF
 - Up to \$16,000 planning permitting
 - Direct subsidy @ \$75/mBTU savings/yr.
 - Decommissioning \$5,000-\$10,000



- Community Solar- share a solar farm and save money
- House of Worship Designer Tax Incentives (up to \$35,000 small church and rectory) for-profit contractors
- Alternative Energy Tax Credits direct pay to non-profits
 - Solar PV with batteries
 - Ground source (geothermal) heat pumps
 - 30% +10% domestic content
- National Grid HEAT insulation and weather stripping- stay tuned fingers crossed
